A note from Fr. Keehner...

As I write this, on the evening of January 13, the snow is once again coming down, the wind is blowing noisily, and yet another snowstorm is heading our way. I was out briefly around sunset and actually found myself shivering, with my teeth chattering. This is something I have not often experienced, and usually in conjunction with a fever! While I was forewarned about the fabled "Ashtabula winter", I never really believed that it was all that it was rumored to be. How wrong I was! And yet, I also noticed earlier this evening as I was looking at the ominous clouds to the northwest, that it is staying light just a bit longer than it was. In just a few weeks, forty days after Christmas, we will celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, more commonly known as Candlemas, a day associated with the blessing of candles to commemorate the fact that Christ came into the world as the light of the world and the source of hope in the midst of a world darkened by sin and suffering. May we, in the coming days look for the light on the horizon and search even in the midst of the cold and snow for the warmth of God's love. May we hold onto our hope that with the lengthening of days, the darkness will be overcome, giving way to the bright promise of salvation, just as night gives way to the brightness of dawn.
